Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, I would like to say a big thank you to everyone who baked, bought and ate cake on Monday during our MacMillan coffee morning. I would also like to thank everyone for their generous contributions on the gate. We are very pleased to inform you that we have now raised the grand total of £107.61! What a fantastic achievement! Thank you so much to everyone. A special mention must go to Mrs Wright for organising the event and the school council for serving us.

It was great to see so many of you at our Harvest Festival at St John's church on Thursday. As always, the children did us proud with their enthusiastic singing, clear reading and even using some sign language during one of their songs! Thank you to Reverend Mulryne for making us feel so welcome at the church, and also to everyone who donated food for the Clacton Food Bank. Your contributions are greatly appreciated. Mrs Hammerton used her creative skills to make a beautiful harvest display using your generous gifts and donations. It really was an example of our Burrsville family working together to help our local community. Thank you also to the staff who have continued to teach high quality lessons, whilst practising for the celebration. Can I please ask, if you did take a photograph before my reminder not to, please do not put it on social media as, for safeguarding reasons, some children's photos cannot be online. Thank you all so much.

This week in school we have been reviewing our safety policies, in particular how we ensure the children evacuate the building and also how we secure or 'lockdown' the school building in the event of an emergency. This could be in the form of a fire, gas or chemical incident in the surrounding area, a dangerous dog or other animal on the school site or an intruder. Next week we will be talking to the children about keeping safe and practising both of these procedures. I will write to you again next week and update you on how we got on.

The roads around our school have been very congested again this week and parents have shared with me on the gate how worried they are that careless and irresponsible driving is going to lead to an accident. I have contacted the North Essex Parking Partnership about patrols around our school, and about joining the 3PR (Three Parking Rules) initiative. I have also emailed Tendring District Council and suggested the refuse collection takes place a little later on the roads around our school. I will keep you updated when I know more. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Every year we mark Armistice Day in school and this year we will again be holding our own special ceremony for the children on Friday 9th November. Miss Bickmore and Mrs Hammerton are in the early stages of organising the event and would like to invite some veterans who could come in to talk to the children. If you know anyone who would be interested in sharing their story with us, please can you let me know or pop into the school office. Many thanks.

Finally, a quick plea... please can you remind children to leave their toys at home and not bring them into school. The staff will let you know when classes are having 'show and tell' sessions. Many thanks in advance.

Next week we have the Royal Albert Hall behaviour reward trip and the football tournament at Kirby Primary Academy.
