It has been an unusual day at school today as it looked like all 206 children had woken up late and turned up in their pyjamas! Of course, this wasn't the case. Instead we have been raising money for Children in Need. Thank you so much for your generous contributions and helping us to raise £178.26 for this worthy charity. It is always so great when we can join together as a school family to support others. I was very proud to receive a postcard yesterday from the Royal British Legion who thanked us for raising a massive £224.34 towards their poppy appeal. Amazingly, we raised the second largest amount from all the schools in Clacton! What a fantastic achievement! Well done everyone!

This week in school we marked anti-bullying week. Miss Davis introduced the week in a special assembly on Monday morning, and the children took part in workshops and special activities to raise awareness and promote the Burrsville Values of love, friendship, equality and respect. Everyone has enjoyed taking part in the week and has been able to confidently talk about any issues they may have had. It was lovely to catch up with many of you at our second parents' evening session on Tuesday. Although a long day for the teachers, I know parents and staff alike find the sessions so valuable. It is also a good opportunity for you to look at your child's work and see what they have been learning in class. Don't forget every Tuesday we have 'Open House' sessions where you can pop in and have a look at books or chat to your child's class teacher. I know our EYFS parents have the option at the next two open house sessions to explore their children's Tapestry learning journals. If you have been having trouble accessing Tapestry or would just like some guidance with it, please do pop by.

On Tuesday, Mrs Lingwood and I had an attendance audit, along with our colleague from Aquinas Attendance Solutions. The audit was very positive and recognised all the hard work Mrs Lingwood and our team put in to ensure school attendance remains a high priority. I am absolutely delighted to share with you that our whole school attendance is currently 97.1%, a massive 2% more than last year! Thank you to everyone for your ongoing support in helping us to improve our attendance by such a great amount. On Wednesday night, the teaching team and I went to Clacton Coastal Academy, along with all other teachers from our local cluster of schools, to moderate our children's work and ensure our judgements are actuate and in-line with others. The session was very positive and the staff felt very proud of the children's hard work which they were able to share.

Thank you to everyone who has already returned the school travel survey. As you know, I am always looking for ways to improve the parking situation around our school. The 3PR initiative could provide us with some support with this, and the travel survey is the first step in exploring this. If you haven't already completed it, please do so and return to school by Tuesday. The more responses we get, the better picture we can build of how we can support you. Thank you in advance.
