Dear Parents and Carers,

We started this week with a whole school assembly which focussed on the learning disposition of independence. To help the children to have a greater understanding of the importance of being independent, I shared a video of an American teenager who had lost his sight at the age of two but had taught himself to do some amazing tricks on the slopes of a skate park. The children were amazed at what this man, who had no sight, could do, and it became a great discussion starter. We are always trying to help children make links between our learning dispositions and the children's learning, and hopefully this has helped them to do this.

Thank you to everyone who completed the school travel survey. Mrs Green and I have been through each one and collated the data you have provided. Today I met with Mrs Syred-Paul, headteacher at Great Clacton, to analyse the results from both schools and plan how our 3PR (3 Parking Rules) package will look.
