Dear Parents/Carers.

I really can't believe how quickly the weeks are flying by! On Monday we welcomed Niamh's mum (Beech class) into school to speak to the children about Canada. Thank you also to our EYFS parents who came into school yesterday for the final 'Family Fun Time' of the year. As always, I hope you found the afternoon useful and informative I know how much the children value your time in school with them. Thank you to our fantastic EYFS team. I was a little disappointed on Wednesday when the whole school went outside to practise sports day together. There were a number of children who were unable to take part because they did not have their PE kit in school or were unable to take their earrings out. As you know, it is our sports day on Monday, and although we have some spare kit, we do not have enough for every child.

Please find some important information about sports day below:

- \cdot We will be sending the children's PE kits home today so they can wear it to school on Monday morning. (If you are reading this and they have forgotten to bring it home don't panic! They will be able to get changed on Monday morning at school.) They will not need their uniform they can stay in their PE kit all day.
- \cdot Your child will need a sun hat, sun cream and a drink to take onto the field with them.
- · Once your child is safely in class on Monday morning, you are free to wait on the school field.
- \cdot As soon as all of the children have been registered, the teachers will bring them outside onto the field ready to begin.
- Each class will complete each activity in the carousel. Points will be awarded for each activity. You are welcome to move round with your child's class.
- · Once sports day has finished, you are free to choose a spot on the field for our family picnic. The gate will be open between us and the junior school so your older children can come and eat with you. Please note, the juniors will be out at about 12.20pm.
- · At 1pm, junior parents will be able to move onto the junior field for their sports day and we will take our children back into class.
- · There will be no school dinners on Monday.

Next week you will be finding out who your child's class teacher will be next year. Then on Wednesday they will spend the morning in their new class with their new teacher. If your child is in year 2, please remember to take your child straight to the junior playground in the morning – they will not return to Burrsville until after lunch.
